NEW B-VARC NETS

For the benefit of those Club members who don't have 2-meter capability, a phone net meets on Wednesdays at 8 PM on 28.735 MHz. It and the 2-meter net on Mondays will complement each other with respect to Club news, but the 10-meter meeting will also include a roundtable segment for whatever of interest might develop.

The two CW nets will meet simultaneously, the slow speed one ranging from $7\frac{1}{2}$ wpm to 10 wpm, and the fast group going at 15 - 18 wpm. Participation in each is open to all amateurs and should result in good practice on CW.

THE TELEGRAPH

Since the dawn of civilization it was learned that there was a need for communications. In early times the movement of a hand or an arm could tell someone to approach or to go to the right or the left.

These, of course, were limited to line of sight. Then the secret of fire was discovered and thus a whole realm of light-signalling was born.

In 429 B.C. the Greeks had developed a crude system of communication by arranging these signal fires over long distances. They also found out their brightly-polished shields blazed with a glare which could be seen for miles.

There were countless other forms -- the huge mirror heliograph on the Island of Capri by which the Emporer Tiberius governed Rome in the last years of his life; the unique voice-telegraph of Julius Caesar where an endless

relay of sentinels shouted messages to each other, extending for miles.

Think of our own United States, with the elaborate smoke signal code of the Indian, the smoke caught into a blanket and sent into the air in puffs; their tom-toms; and the unique method by which the news of the opening of the Erie Canal was sent from Buffalo to New York City in eighty minutes by a line of booming cannon located within hearing distance of each other.

The next step in signalling remained for a painter of landscapes and portraits, Samuel Finley Breeze Morse, to develop.



Thanks, NOAA Weather Service in Houston, Texas, for making our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day much better than it otherwise would have been.


AT THE JANUARY MEMBERSHIP MEETING


AMATEUR RADIO NOVICE CLASS


"WANT TO GET A HAM RADIO"

The Traffic Jam Net (TJN) is a 2-meter traffic net that was instituted some months ago to meet at 6:30 PM.local time Mondays through Fridays on the 60/00 machine to handle traffic into and out of the Houston area for the National Traffic System and other traffic nets, as a service to those stations which, for any one of several reasons, cannot work the HF nets.

At times, a fair amount of traffic has been handled, but activity has been dropping, both in checkins and available net control operators. One reason for this, we are informed, has been a lack of management interest and organizational activity.

These sources state that it is still believed a real need for this traffic handling availability still exists in the Houston metropolital area.

A meeting, to discuss the subject has been called for 7:30 PM on Monday, January 11 at the DPS headquarters, which is located just off the Highway 290 exit at the north end of the West Loop. All interested haws are urged to attend.

Talk-in will be on 147.60/00 and, when approaching DPS Hqtrs., on 146.52/52.
