B-VARC IN PUBLIC SERVICE

Part 97 of the F.C.C's. rules and regulations is designed to provide for an amateur radio service having a number of principles as the basis for its existence. One of these principles is:

Recognition of the value and enhancement of the amateur radio service to the public as a voluntary and non-commercial communication service.

One of the areas of public service that B-VARC members have been busy in for the last two or three years is helping to provide communications in various civic activities, such as the Houston Festival, the Houston-Tenneco Marathon, the Village 5 Run, the Bayou City Fun Run, etc.

Last year the Club was asked to provide such communications service for the first time for the Regatta at Lake Houston, the Mission Bend 10K Run, and the Bellaire-Rotary Road Race.

During the last few weeks we did this job as a Club function for the Bellaire-Rotary Road Race, the March of Dimes WALK AMERICA walkathon in Stafford-Missouri City-Sugar Land area, and the Fleet Feet 10K Fun Run at the University of Houston, a new event.
