The Red Cross is responsible, during emergencies, for shelters in twelve contiguous counties.

- It was determined that Lloyd will make the Order Of the Key awards.
- Harold stated that Ron, KA5GYG, will poll the board members for the Order of the Key award recipients.
- Steve will chair the nominating committee along with Jerry, WD5HQU, to nominate a slate of candidates for officers to be elected at the November general membership meeting.
- Allan has printed an up to date membership roster.
- It was suggested that Sam, N5CPA, send a roster, new membership packet, and copy of the by-laws to new members.
- Carl, WB8SYR, reported by proxy that there is no formal committment from the Cellar Door Texas Inn for our annual banquet which will be January 10. He will again contact the restaurant after the October meeting when he will get a better idea of the number who will attend.
- Lloyd had an idea concerning depositing the club account with Western Savings, at 5 1/4% interest rate on \$100 minimum.
- Harold reported on items in the ARRL letter which we will receive as a Special Service Club.
- Lloyd reported the computer bulletin board checkin is ready to go at the convention.
