President Harold Parker, ND5F, called the meeting to order in the offices of Vic, K5KNH, at 7:30 p.m. Present were Ken KA5DKS, Harold ND5F, Paul N5FQS, Ron KA5GYG, Lloyd WD5HEH, Phil WB5LIZ, Jim W5RNK, Sallie KA5RXW, Steve KE5SC, Kenny KA5UPB, and Carter KD5XX. Minutes of the last meeting were reviewed.

Because he could not stay for the entire meeting, Phil Cooper WB5LIZ, spoke first to the Board concerning a letter he had received from the Veterans Administration about setting up an amateur radio station at the VA Hospital. The VA wants 1.6 to 30 MHz capability, also, an ARRL Emergency Coordinator must be the Trustee of the station.

Special Committee Reports:

- AUDIT Lloyd and Mark, KASNYI, have had difficulty in getting together for the audit. Lloyd is in contact with the IRS in Austin concerning any requirement of the club.
- SPECIAL EVENTS Upcoming is the Bayou City Fun Run March 23, in conjunction with The Houston Festival '85 during the week ends of March 23 and 24, also 30 and 31. Contact Dick Hawkins W5DWI, to volunteer for communications either of these week ends.

Standing Committee Reports:

- PUBLIC RELATIONS Paul has written 2 major and 4 minor newspapers asking to whom press releases should be sent. He also is still looking for someone to help with correspondence. The program March 14 will be given by Andy MacAllister WASZİB, on AMSAT.
- EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS Ed Harwell W5WVX, not being present, Ron reported that on Tuesday night Judge Jadie Stavinhoa had assumed all responsibility for emergency communications in Fort Bend County.
- TRAINING Bobby Webb WASCAC, being absent, Kenny reported that a final site selection for field Day had not been made. He also stated that he can secure an RV for the Field Day week end. Harold asked for comments on the new 2 meter net format. Comments were favorable. Harold suggested updating the net preamble, also he suggested we should be listed in the net directory; ARES and RACES.
- TECHNICAL ADVANCEMENT Steve reported he has 6 candidates for the Novice class, Jim reported that he had 2 more. Another Volunteer Examination will be held March 23. A critique will be held March 16. Jim will build equipment so that headsets can be used for the code test.
- MEMBERSHIP SERVICES Kenny asked Ron to relate an incident when the illegal use of amateur frequencies by employees of a local theater chain was discovered. The FCC was advised.
- PUBLICATIONS Lloyd stated that all the latest information is in the bulletin on new members and upgrades.

Wade, WNSTEN, reported he and Steve, KESSC, have 4 in the Novice class being taught at Autumn Hills in Richmond.

Bobby, WASCAC, reported on Field Day; Kenny will get an RV, they are inclined to go to the Brazos Bend State Park.

Harold, ND5F, reminded the Club of the nest Volunteer Examination at 9:00 a.m., March 23, a critique of the last exam will be March 16, 8:00 a.m Deadline for applying for the April 27 Volunteer Examination is March 28. There will be a Teleconference on March 29, topics will be antenna design and the VHF repeater band plan; listen on 147.09, 147.33 or 146.64. Westlink is low on money and will accept contributions. Cable companies want to increase leakage allowed. Letters to the FCC concerning interference are incouraged.

Carl, WB8SVR, stated there will be a 50 - 50 drawing during the break, the Club's 50% to be donated to the Westlink Report. Carl will talk to George Walker about an ad in the Ham Com bulletin concerning our club's raffle of a TS-430 transceiver at Ham Com.

Steve, WASOEN, spoke of the MS-150 Bike Tour stating there are 20 hams interested, there will be a meeting next week. He also mentioned the Sharpstown Mother's Day event.

Lloyd WD5HEH, read the change to the by-laws, adding to ARTICLE VI - DUES 3. Any person becoming a licensed amateur radio operator for the first time, upon application, may be granted membership in the Club for the balance of that year. Discussion followed. A vote on the change will be taken at the April meeting.

Kenny, KASUPB, made the awards presentations: Outstanding Member, Sam Wilson, NSCPA, and Outstanding Operator, Stu Lamkin, WBSIGG.
