# MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING APRIL 4,1985

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by the President, Harold ND5F, in the offices of Vic K5KNH. Present were Bobby WA5CAC, Ken KA5DKS, Jeff N5ECP, Harold ND5F, Ron KA5GYG, Jim W5RNK, Steve KE5SC, Kenny KA5UPB, and Carter KD5XX.

OPERATING ACTIVITIES - Harold reported for Roger, WASRNL, who was absent, that he(Roger) would like to see a local committee formed, a representative from each net, to help coordinate net activities.

Ron had several items for the Board. The frequency 444.525 MHz has been assigned for the MS 150 Bike Tour after which the antenna will be placed at the 70 foot level of the tower at the Rosenberg Fire Station. NSECP is the Trustee. Steve, WASDEN, has made the initial contact for the Sharpstown event. It will be in the same location as last year.

Steve, KESSC, reports 7 students in the Novice Class, they have studied the complete alphabet in code. Everyone is enthusiastic, there have been inquiries about the next class. Steve will attend the next organizational meeting for Ham Com the 8th.
