

Meeting of the Board of Directors of The Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club April 3, 1997

A quorum of the Board of Directors met at Vaso's Restaurant on April 3, 1997. This was the fourth meeting of the calendar year. The meeting was called to order by President, Gailen Marshall --N4SKR, at 6:30 P.M.

The following Board Members and guests were present: Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, Terri Van Slyke -- W5BKK, Bud King -- N5UOG, Ron Grimes -- WA5SCE, Charles Prochaska -- KG5KV, John Dryton -- KM5HP, Mike Hardwick -- N5VCX, Jack Van Demark -- WN5A, and Terry McCoy -- W5TEM.

President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, stated that an audit committee had been formed consisting of Dale Brown -- KC2PZ, Steve Gottleib -- WA5OEN, and Randy Pollard -- AK5G, and that a report would be available at the next board meeting.

The Minutes for the March board meeting were approved with a motion that passed unanimously.

Treasurer, Nizar Mullani -- K0NM, presented a Treasurer's report dated 4/10/97, showing \$ 1,760.00 in CD, \$ 3, 185.06 in checking, and \$ 120.00 and change in petty cash for a total of \$ 5, 065.06 and change. The Treasurer's

report was approved with a motion that passed unanimously.

Corresponding Secretary, John Dryton -- KM5HP, stated that he is keeping the membership roster current and has 40 membership applications.

President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, said that Allen Mattis -- N5AFV, had asked for a report of the results of his membership drive. Corresponding Secretary, John Dryton -- KM5HP, stated that he had received a positive response from one member, and would get a report together for Allen.

Recording Secretary, Terri Van Slyke -- W5BKK, reported that 13 meals had been sold for the upcoming picnic.

Mike Hardwick -- N5VCX, gave a Public Service report. He stated that the upcoming MS 150 still needed volunteers. He reported that Jackie Burton -- KC5OHJ, was coordinating the radio portion of the Clean Air Challenge.

President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, stated that he needed an update on Field Day plans from Allen Brier -- WB5BIR. He also was waiting for information regarding B-VARC logo items. He said that insurance papers were needed to reserve the pavilion for Field Day. Jack Van Demark -- WN5A, said that ARRL had the insurance papers and would fax them to Harris County. Concern was expressed regarding interference by the "squirrel" on the repeater.

Mike Hardwick -- N5VCX expressed concern regarding the current direction of club meetings. He said that he felt like meetings were not club oriented and didn't feel that the Board meetings on the air had been successful. Discussion followed regarding club meeting structure and pros and cons of Board meetings on the air.

Past President, Ron Grimes -- WA5SCE, Treasurer, Nizar Mullani -- K0NM, and Board Member, Terry McCoy --W5TEM, all stated that they liked the Board meetings on the air.

President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, said that he would continue in the same direction regarding club meetings and felt that Board meetings on the air had been successful with the exception of a few problems. He added that meeting attendance had been good. He stated the need to determine the opinion of the club membership regarding these issues.

Treasurer, Nizar Mullani -- K0NM, said the he felt we needed to examine these issues and determine if we are losing the "club" feeling. He stated that we need a strong program for enhancing B-VARC and a Social/Public Relations person.

Board Member, Bud King -- N5UOG, stated that he didn't like the Board meetings on the air. He offered his home for the next Board meeting. He also stated that he wanted a more specific amount in the Treasurer's report.

Mike Hardwick -- N5VCX, suggested using a bulletin board for club announcements and events. John Dryton

-- KM5HP, was appointed to chair a committee to create this bulletin board.

President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, reported that some problems exist in the current newsletter format and he would discuss these with Newsletter Editor, Scott Pederson -- KI5DR.

Mike Hardwick -- N5VCX, reported that the Houston Amateur Radio Club had been disbanded and that the charter could be reactivated. He suggested doing this and making the club a central control point of information for Houston and surrounding areas. He stated that there has been interest from other clubs and volunteered to be a member of a committee formed to research this idea.

With no further business, this meeting was adjourned by President, Gailen Marshall -- N4SKR, at 7:15 P.M. with a motion, second and unanimous vote.

Morse Code to the Rescue

The Morse Distress Watch will be discontinued on a worldwide basis on December 31 this year. This has been in use since 1912.

Russian-registry ship uses Morse Code after becoming disabled off the Netherlands

The Vera (Russian-registry 1,750-dwt dry cargo ship) was disabled recently when a bridge window broke during bad weather. Water that entered through the hole shut down electrical equipment on the bridge, and the ship drifted towards Terschelling Island, the Netherlands. The only communication equipment working was a 500 KHz broadcasting unit, which the crew used to send a CW (Morse Code) distress signal a station in Ostend, Belgium, received the signal and the ship was assisted by tugs.

Public Service Corner

Well, the Spring Public Service season is winding to a close. After the Clean Air Challenge things will most likely be quiet for the hot summer months, only to return once again this fall.

Just one final word of thanks to everyone who pitched in and helped out this year so far. As it stands, B-VARC (and other clubs) have donated almost 5,000 man-hours of volunteer time this year so far, starting with the Marathon. If we were paid \$25 per hour as communication consultants, we would have donated over \$119,000! This does

not include the recruiting, meetings, coordination and setup of these events.

So what's in store? B-VARC is currently investigating the possibility of pooling resources with other Houston ham clubs to -

- Get more involvement for individual events
- Spread the workload a little more evenly
- Give the public a more professional image of Amateurs
- Get practice coordinating with other clubs in the event of a REAL disaster.

Some of this may not happen, or all of these items plus some other benefits we never dreamed of may result. The problem lies in the recent drop in participation from club members. B-VARC is not alone in this, as other Houston ham clubs are experiencing the same drop off rates.

So what do we do? Do we decline to offer some of the organizations free communications support? How do we kick some of the inactive members into gear to step up and volunteer? Should we? Could we pool resources with other clubs, and get the job done without dabbling in the politics of the different clubs?

Personally, I am against begging and pleading our club members to come out and participate in these events. If they do not wish to help, there's nothing I can say that will convince them otherwise. Unfortunately the most effective approach has been to continually call B-

VARC members on the telephone and ask them to participate.

This is why I feel our best chance of keeping the number of volunteers available for these events is to pool resources from other ham clubs. So far this has had some WONDEROUS side effects. For example, B-VARC has been invited to participate in a FoxHunt with the Compaq ham club this summer. In addition, we've already seen some increased participation from the NARS group, as well as the ECHO club in events which were historically staffed by B-VARC members. In fact, the Walk For Arthritis last weekend had more hams from NARS than B-VARC!

The bottom line is - we are seeing less participation in PS Events from hams in general, yet the need for hams is increasing every year. The events we coordinate are getting larger, and new events are springing up everywhere. The need is here NOW. It's time to act.

Walter Holmes, K5WH has devised an ingenious little setup using Internet Phone software on his PC and a connection to a radio with VOX capabilities. When someone calls his number on the Internet, they have the ability to converse on the 146.760 repeater, located at the Compaq campus on FM249 and Louetta.

How does it work? Quite simple - the audio output from the sound card on his PC is connected to the audio input of his radio. The radio is equipped with a VOX circuit to automatically key the radio when the person speaks on the I-Phone connection. Conversely, the audio coming out of the radio is fed into

the microphone input of the sound card, and the software does the rest.

This has resulted in some amazing conversations on 2 meters from hams around the world who check in regularly. Without too much difficulty, a repeater in another city could be connected the same way, and a link be established between repeaters in two different cities!

Too bad they do not count for Field Day!
