THE CAVALLA AND STEWART ANTENNA RESTORATION PROJECT / UPDATE

Last month, K5IZO John, K5EWJ Cookie, KE5WCP Stephen, AF5T Sparks, and WS5H Bill showed up for the looksee / troubleshoot of the USS Cavalla longwire antenna and Stewart radio room at the volunteer work weekend at SEAWOLF PARK. I am very pleased with the Ham turn-out for both club members and non-members alike. In May, we should be able to complete the Cavalla antenna with the original crew and any additional help that shows. Cookie, of TXDS, has purchased the material needed for the longwire project. Further inspection of the one of two Stewart longwires will need to be fixed and need to remove the old window AC unit out off the floor of the Stewart radio room. Plenty of work is needed on both ships.

The next work weekend is May 8th and 9th. Please come out to help and restore the antennas. This will allow all hams in our area to enjoy both the Stewart and the Cavalla Radio Rooms by getting on the air or donating to the CAVALLA HISTORICAL FOUNDATION R.R. 8, BOX 10, PELICAN ISLAND, GALVESTON, TX. 77554.

A report of the last work weekend is below.

Arrived to the park around 8:15 with Sparks. At gate entrance delivered 2 1/2 cases of water (1/2 case fit into the iced cooler at gate) for the volunteers. R.O.T.C. Navy was just beginning to paint on the old cold war red water line on one side of the sub. Notified our intentions and gave a list of our volunteer crew to expedite their entry. I believe that all who came out had no problems gaining access to the ships.

The BVARC donation check, letter from our club president, the certificates from MSWE 2009 (3 copys for ships, CHF, John C.O.B.- chief of boat) was delivered to John, COB, and we were given permission to begin our project for volley weekend with antenna trouble shoot and the Stewart radio room. Keys were given for the day and all access granted in our efforts of repair.

The written antenna reports were reviewed and a good plan to fix for upcoming work weekend. The AC window unit donated by contributions from BVARC members, SHOT chapter and individuals ham and non ham was installed in the radio room by the contractors that repaired damages from IKE- powered up and blows cold. Had to leave a good extention 110 cord as we have electrical issues in the radio room (transformer doa and most outlets are non fuctional from IKE)

John C.O.B trouble shooted the power problem with us and installed some flouresent bulbs as now have good lighting in the Stewart radio room. We have 110 outlets for the AC and radio power supply. He said he would get back to me / us on the transformer problem as he will need the full power for a full array of 110 outlets and if we ever get around to firing up the old WW2 high volt transmitter.

The 2 ship's longwires on the Stewart: Antenna 1 -- used in MSWE 2008, but is not working. The inspection revealed an exterior inspection cover was blown away by Ike and is most likely full of salt water. Also possible that it was hit by lightning. We need to clean out and cover ASAP. -- Antenna 2 -- checked out ok with no shorts and was used with the radio gear I brought out to make some Q's (20 contacts for signal reports) and got good 5/9 reports SSB . CW was tested with the antenna and that was put in the log also. I see good 599 on tx and rec in the log.

We had a rain out 1/2 way through the day, but still, much was discovered and repaired. The Stewart radio room is good to go for MSWE 2010 and upon my departure from the park John COB (chief of boat) gave us -- BVARC KK5W -- permission to come aboard for MSWE 2010

I have notified the MSWE sponsor NJ2BB USS NEW JERSEY. We are now on the list of ships on their website – www.nj2bb.org

BVARC Historical Vignettes – Part 1: BVARC and its ARRL Affiliation

How many of you have noticed that the club summary on the BVARC newsletter states that “The American Radio Relay League (ARRL) has recognized the club’s commitment of service with the coveted status of Special Service Club.” Why is this status coveted? Perhaps it is because the club went through a great deal of difficulty in its efforts to apply for the special service club status.

In the first few years of BVARC’s existence one of the things that stands out when you read the club newsletters is that the club leadership had decided to affiliate with the American Radio Relay League. The September 1980 club newsletter indicates that an ARRL Affiliation Committee had been formed and that “This activity has gotten to the top of the priority list of the chairman and work has started on accumulating information required to accompany the affiliation application. One of the requirements is that at least 51% of Club members also be members of ARRL, and it appears at this writing that we’ll make it. A firm target date for filing the application is not yet in sight but it will be as soon as possible.”

In November 1980 BVARC received a letter from the Club and Training Department of the ARRL. The ARRL had completing checking over BVARC’s application for club affiliation and had forwarded it to ARRL West Gulf Division Director Ray Wangler, W5EDZ, in San Antonio for “proper endorsement.” In January 1981 Ray Wangler notified BVARC that he approved the application and that he wanted to present the affiliate charter personally to the club. Wangler presented the charter to BVARC at the February 1981 general membership meeting, and the process to become a regular ARRL affiliated club had taken six months.

Two years later when Steve Gottlieb, WA5OEN, was president, the BVARC leadership decided to apply for ARRL Special Service Club status, a higher level of club affiliation. Vice president Ron Bolyard, KA5GYG, wrote in the February 1983 club newsletter “Our goal for the year is to become eligible for a SPECIAL SERVICE CLUB by ARRL. It will require a supreme effort by the entire membership to achieve this objective. I believe we have the people; all we need now is make the commitment to do, and have the motivation to perform.” In April 1983 Bolyard was overloaded with job responsibilities, and the BVARC board of directors appointed Harold Parker, ND5F, to be the new BVARC Special Service Club Coordinator.

Parker helped arrange for ARRL West Gulf Division Director Ray Wangler, W5EDZ, to be the speaker at the June 1983 general membership meeting. Wangler was brought up to speed on BVARC and its activities and was told that BVARC would be submitting an application for Special Service Club in the near future.

In the November 1983 newsletter it was reported that “Harold Parker has done a super job of preparing the letter of application” for BVARC to become a Special Service Club and the application was ready to be submitted. In the April 1984 club newsletter Harold Parker stated “Our application was received [by the ARRL] and we are anxiously awaiting notification that it has been approved.” In the May 1984 newsletter Harold Parker again wrote “Our application was submitted for the Special Service Club designation...” However, the minutes of the June 1984 BVARC board meeting contained a bombshell: “Harold, ND5F, reported that the application for the designation of Special service Club is nowhere to be found! It is lost. We have a Post Office Return Receipt for the first stop on the way to Newington but the application can not be traced from there.”

How did BVARC recover from the loss of its Special Service Club application? Next month this Historical Vignette will continue.

Minutes of April 1st, 2009 Board of Directors meeting of the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club:

Rick Hiller called the monthly Board of Directors meeting for the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club to order at 7:10 PM on April 1st, 2009 at Fudrucker's, 11445 Fountain Lake Drive, Stafford, TX. Attending were: Rick Hiller, W5RH (Pres.); Kirk Kendrick, KK2Z (VP); (Past Pres.); Peter Sauermilch, KD5QPX (Rec. Sec.); David Barber, K5NDB, (At-Large Dir.); Charles Frost, K5LBU (Past Pres); Norma Stone, KE5NDN; Bill Stone, WS5H; Cameron Mitchell, K5CAM; Eddie Runner, NU5K.

- 1) Minutes for the February 2009 meeting were approved as they appear in the March 2009 newsletter.
- 2) Treasurer's Report was presented by email and approved by the Board.
- 3) Old Business:
 - a) Kendrick reported on the AV problems of the March General Membership Meeting (GMM).
 - b) Sauermilch reported that no progress has been made on the club asset list.
 - c) Hiller reported that the Greater Houston Hamfest (GHH) financial figures looked good as they improved from 2009. Additional discussion was deferred to a meeting when the other GHH principals would be present, as they were not at this meeting.
- 4) New business:
 - a) Kendrick reported that the Monday Net Control Operators had not been getting a list of GMM main topics and that he would provide such to them in the future.
 - b) Hiller reported that the BVARC members who are working on re-establishing Houston Amateur Radio Club as an independent entity are moving forward with that effort. No estimate is available for completion.
 - c) Stone reported that on April 10th, there is a workday at Sea Wolf Park. If BVARC members intended to operate Museum Ship Weekend (1st weekend in June) from one of those ships, then members needed to show up and do some work. He would make a similar announcement on the Monday Net. Stone also asked the club donate \$150 to the Cavala Historical Foundation. A motion was made and passed to make said donation. Stone asked the club to reimburse up to \$35 for supplies and expenses for the Saturday workday. A motion was made and passed to make said donation. Stone reported that we intended to send BVARC newsletters to both the Cavala Historical Foundation and to the curator of Sea Wolf Part to establish that BVARC is a legitimate organization.
- 5) Other Business:
 - a) Hiller reported that the Pearland tailgate is on April 10th.
 - b) Hiller reported that no Field Day organizational meeting is yet on the schedule.
 - c) Runner asked if the list of Traffic Nets that was recited during on of the Monday Nets was available for the web site. Sauermilch told him that C. Kimtantas created the list and was the one to contact.
- 6) Meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM

BVARC Museum Ships Challenge

A BVARC Club Contest

If you are going down to the KK5W operation for the Museum Ships Weekend Event on Pelican Island, then good for you and “thanks” for supporting BVARC Events. But, if you are not going down (due to having to attend your cousins wedding or maybe even working), we have a way you can participate. It’s called the “BVARC Museum Ships Challenge”. It’s a contest, for BVARC members only.

The goal is to work as many official Museum Ships as you can, on as many bands as you can, in as many modes as you can.

Event: BVARC Museum Ships Challenge

Date: June 5 and 6.

Time: Local -- anytime during June 5 and 6

Frequency: Any frequency band the ships are operating (160 thru 440 MHZ, WARC, too)

Mode: Any mode that the ships are operating

Points: All QSO’s are 1-point*(Limit one per mode per band)

(a 40 meter SSB contact =1pt; a 40 meter CW contact = 1pt; a 40 meter PSK contact =1pt)

NOTE: KK5W (The Stewart, Cavalla and Seawolf Park stations score 2 points per QSO, per mode.

Multipliers: Number of different Museum Ships that you work.

Stewart and Cavalla and the Seawolf Park station are 3 individual multipliers, so be sure to note which one you are talking to.

Score: Total points = Total Q’s x Number of different ships worked.

Operate fixed, mobile, and/or portable – it does not matter.

*Rules: 1) Your contact must be with a recognized Museum Ship, as per the Museum Ships Web site www.nj2bb.org
2) You can operate KK5W and then go home and work ships and even KK5W from home in this contest – no problem.

Hamfest Season is Here!

Successful AMSAT Activities at the 2010 Greater Houston Hamfest

AMSAT was well represented again this year at the Greater Houston Hamfest (GHH) held March 6, 2010 at the Fort Bend County Fairgrounds in Rosenberg, Texas, southwest of Houston. The GHH is billed as the fastest growing hamfest in Texas and this year the GHH again hosted the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) South Texas Section Convention. ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND, and ARRL West Gulf Division director Dr. David Woolweaver, K5RAV, were the featured speakers. The GHH had all of the usual hamfest activities including over 18,000 square feet of indoor exhibit space, tables for vendors and individuals, a free tailgate area with early buyer access before the main hall opened, Amateur Radio related presentations and exhibits, and VE testing sessions.

Allen Mattis, N5AFV, presented a talk entitled "More OSCAR Satellites Active

Today than Ever Before" that was attended by 45 people. Arrows, Elks, Pryme AL-800s and other curious, homebrew, hand-held antennas were everywhere. Over 85 people attended the two satellite demonstrations and approximately 20 contacts were made.

The Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club (BVARC), organizer of the hamfest, fully supported the AMSAT activities again this year by giving away a Kenwood TH-F6A HT, Arrow antenna and duplexer as the raffle second prize at the hamfest.
