BVARC Winter Field Day 2023

Where: Brazos Bend State Park 21901 FM 762 Rd Needville, TX 77461

When: January 28th - 29th 2023 (From Saturday at 10am until we wrap up on Sunday afternoon)

Winter Field Day 2023 is fast approaching, and in case you missed it, BVARC is officially participating! We will be camping out at Brazos Bend State Park on January 28th through the 29th operating five HF stations for the entire 24-hour contest period. The modes we will be set up to operate include voice (SSB), CW, and digital (RTTY, JS8Call, VarAC, etc.). Our goal is to assemble a portable operation in the park running on emergency power only and operate as many modes and bands as we can.

In order to achieve this, **WE NEED YOU** to operate our stations, log lots of contacts, and make BVARC a top contender in this worldwide contest! No matter your license class or experience level, you can come and operate at our stations using the club call sign with help and guidance from your fellow hams. You can come by and operate for a few hours, or camp with us overnight (see details below). We hope you will join us for a great time practicing emergency radio operation, having some delicious food, and enjoying the company of your fellow hams.

Details about BVARC's WFD event:

- We have rented two screened shelters at Brazos Bend State Park and will be operating and camping at those locations for the duration of the event.
- Talk-in will be on the 146.940 MHz repeater to provide directions to the park and our campsite. Also the park rangers will be aware of our event and can direct you to our site.
- A sign-up sheet for operators and volunteers is posted on the BVARC website (BVARC.org). Operating slots are listed in one-hour increments, and those who sign up first will have priority when selecting bands during their time slot.
- We have a limited number of overnight camping space at *our* sites (you may rent your own if available). If you would like to camp with us please put the name of all campers on the sign-up sheet. You will also need to bring your own tent and/or sleeping bag.
- The contest hours are 1pm CST Saturday January 28th to 12:59pm CST Sunday January 29th. Of course we will work in a little Parks on the Air a few hours before and after the WFD contest hours if you'd like to participate in that as well.
- All five HF stations will be ready to operate on SSB and will have a PC with logging software and digital mode software. You do not need to bring any radio equipment.
- Lunch Saturday will be hot dogs (veggie option available), dinner will be a few different curries and rice (prepared by me), and breakfast Sunday morning will be coffee, pastries, and maybe even kolaches!
- Standard day use fee of \$7/person applies (free if you are a Texas State Park Pass holder). Please see tpwd.texas.gov for further details about park admission.



Where in the World is...

Vatican City (HV) CQ Zone 15 ITU Zone 28





Vatican City: the smallest independent nation in the world is a landlocked country surrounded by the city of Rome, Italy. A mere 109 acres, it is smaller than most Texas ranches, but it holds sway over more than 1,329,000,000 baptized Catholics worldwide. Yes, they really keep a count.


Only half of the less than 1000 residents have citizenship. Mainly members of the Church's diplomatic Corps. The rest hold temporary residential rights to live on Vatican land.

The Holy See dates to early Christianity, with the Apostle Peter being the first pope. After 1377, the popes have mainly resided at the Apostolic Palace within

what is now Vatican City. There have been 265 popes since Peter. The Vatican state became independent from Italy in 1929 with the Lateran Treaty between the Vatican and Italy, its government known as the Holy See. The Vatican City State is an ecclesiastical monarchy ruled by the <u>Pope</u> who is the bishop of Rome and head of the Catholic Church. The highest state functionaries are all Catholic clergy of various origins.

Vatican City contains religious and cultural sites such as St. Peter's Basilica, the Sistine Chapel, and the Vatican Museums. They feature some of the world's most famous paintings and sculptures. Vatican City has no taxes and items are duty-free. As the Holy See, it derives its income from the voluntary contributions of more than one billion Roman Catholics worldwide, as well as interest on investments and the sale of stamps, coins, and publications. Banking operations and expenditures have been reported publicly since the early 1980s.

Vatican City has its own telephone system, post office, gardens, astronomical observatory, radio station, banking system, and pharmacy, as well as a contingent of Swiss Guards responsible for the personal safety of the pope since 1506.



The Swiss Guards really are Swiss. To be a member you must be male, 5feet, 6 inches tall. Be a Swiss Citizen between 19 and 30 years of age; single and completed Swiss military service. The Guard serves as both an honor guard and a security service for the Pope.

HV5PUL is active since 1997 at the Pontifical Lateran University in Vatican City. You can get information about QS postal costs and their QSL policy. Also check their website www.hv5pul.info.

According to the CLUB LOG website, www.clublog.org Vatican City is ranked 105th on their Most Wanted list. QRZ.com only lists fifteen licensed hams with the HV prefix

The next BVARC test session is **Saturday, January 7th at 10:30**.

For new licensees the testing fee, paid at the session is \$15. An additional \$35 license fee (totaling \$50), will be collected by the FCC separately for new, renewal and vanity calls. License upgrades do not pay the added \$35 fee, just the \$15 session fee.

YOUTH LICENSING INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The ARRL has created a youth program (18 and under) to defray the licensing costs to a total of **\$5** (deducting the \$35 increase and \$10 off the \$15 VE session fee). See: http://www.arrl.org/youth-licensing-grant-program

Also, BVARC is implementing it's own program for youth licensing.

We'll provide a <u>new VHF/UHF transceiver (Baofeng, limited supply)</u> at the VE session, to youth that successfully pass their Technician test. This is the result of a very generous grant from a BVARC member.

Bottom line, a young person for \$5, can walk into a test session and walk out with a new radio and a pending license.

Examination sessions are held each month, usually on the same day as the Saturday BVARC Board meeting (most times, the first Saturday of the month). These sessions are at the Bayland Park Community Center, 6400 Bissonnet St., Houston TX 77074.
