In our board meetings and planning meetings I've seen various helpful and positive suggestions brought by members. Some members have expressed that newer or novel ideas they have brought to the board were shut down without a fair shake. Other members have expressed an interest in seeing the presidency move on to a newer generation. Candidate for President Position – Mike Hardwick, N5VCX

The club's elections this year are at unique time for BVARC. With the Greater Houston HamFest being elevated to the West Gulf Division Convention and the possibility of a \$20,000 grant to the club from the ARRL, a status quo must be maintained in the leadership of the club.

To manage a club the size of BVARC (which is the second largest in Texas) there are three qualifications that are needed. They are **Experience**, **Knowledge**, and **Dedication**. My background easily supports those qualifications.

- Over 36 years as a Land Mobile Radio Professional with worldwide experience
- Over 34 years as an amateur radio operator, starting as a Novice in 1969
- My 31 years in BVARC includes 10 years on the BOD and 14 years as President
- Starting Mix-n-Match Swap Meet in 2002, which 2007 became **Greater Houston HamFest**

I have also supported other amateur radio functions in the greater Houston/Harris County area by becoming BVARC's Public Event Service coordinator in 1994. This position provided radio communication support to many non-profit organizations on their fund-raising events. These events included bicycle rides, fun runs, Para Olympics, and the SPCA K-9 Run in downtown Houston. Some of the high points over the 20 years as Public Service Event Coordinator are:

- Coordinated communications for over 300 events
- Served as the communications chairperson for the last 30 years for the MS150 Bike Ride
- Providing support for the Wings Over Houston Air Show with communications vehicles
- Providing communications equipment for ARES exercises throughout the Houston area

After Hurricane Katrina and Rita devastated the Gulf Coast area, I was asked to help form a group to provide communications for hospitals. This group become **Hams for Hospitals** which served over 25 hospitals in the Houston area. During this time, I also was asked to coordinate the first ever ham radio exercise to prepare for a mass evacuation from the coast along major roadways.

Besides serving on the BOD and providing communications for events, I have also supported amateur radio in the regulatory process. I provided testimony at a 2014 Texas State Senate Hearing on a bill banning cellphone use. This bill would have also banned use of amateur radio use in cars. Recently, I was invited to attend an informational meeting on bill H.R. 4006 between John Stratton, ARRL West Gulf Division Director, and Senator Ted Cruz. This bill, "Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act" is being introduced to remove barriers that govern private land use restrictions on amateur radio.

My background truly contains the qualifications of **Experience**, **Knowledge**, and **Dedication** to support a club like BVARC. Only time, hard work and "paying dues" can a person learn and develop these qualifications. There is really no way that **Experience**, **Knowledge**, and **Dedication** can be shown or learned in three years, two years or even ten months.

On November 9th, I am asking for your support for BVARC President at the general meeting. Your support for me can help maintain the stability of the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club.

Becoming a One Percenter, the Old-Fashioned Way

Yes, that's me, ambitious and energetic, at the age of 75. I am working my way up to the status of one in a hundred, a one percenter. I am hoping to join that club very soon, but don't come to me looking for a loan. This isn't about money. It's about being among the one percent who use Morse Code to communicate in ham radio.

Oh sure, I learned code at the rate of five words per minute to get my novice license back in the early 60's. But I never got on the air. You already know the excuses – girls, school, work, school, girls, career (did I mention girls) and family. But I never lost the urge and now in retirement I have time and the inclination to pursue it. I started my latest push to learn CW in January, leisurely working my way through the exercises provided on YouTube by the Morse Code Ninja (https://morsecode.ninja/), an amazing project to help you learn Morse Code. Kurt Zoglmann has created hundreds of audio YouTubes that help you learn the letters by sound, not by memorizing a reference list of dots and dashes. He'll take you through the letters, the numbers and other characters, then instant character recognition, and then whole word recognition. His project is not monetized.

Over the summer I began to hear of something called the Long Island CW Club (https://longislandcwclub.org/). It is just what the name says – a club that helps members learn CW, but also get on the air using CW. It has grown by leaps and bounds over the last few years, now serving hundreds of members. It's thirty dollars per year to belong, and for that you are treated to more Zoom and live interactive teaching and learning sessions than you can imagine.

You pay only with the time you in invest in your learning efforts.

The founders have done a lot of research into the best ways to learn and use Morse Code and one of the most important lessons they've incorporated into the effort is taking all the pressure out of the process. You learn by doing and have fun in the process. No angry teachers, just instructors who are on their own path to learn and improve. And their big goal is to get you on the air as quickly as possible.

Learning to use CW is a great pursuit for new and experienced hams as well. And combined with the opportunities of low power QRP operations in Parks on the Air, you'll have lots of fun. A lot of hams enjoy digital operations such as FT8, but it's important to realize that the first form of digital communication was Morse Code. It's binary, just dits and dahs, instead of ones and zeros used in the computer world. CW generally propagates further with lower power than SSB. In fact you can be extremely effective with CW from a park bench using a QRP rig you built yourself. Five watts will do it and your whole rig will weigh less than the lunch and bottle of water you take along.

There are many other resources available as well, besides the ones I've mentioned here, including the well-known CW Academy. Go for that or investigate one of the plans outlined in this article, and if you're willing to put in a little time every day, you will get there. That is, you will get the chance to join the one percent who know and use CW. Good Luck!


November Brews with BVARC

The Dayton Hamvention May 2024

So why talk about Dayton Hamvention in November and the 3 day Hamvention event doesn't start until May 17th. A few reasons, like, it is 1,120 miles away so you have to drive or fly (booking early might mean lower fares). Also, that you will have to get a hotel room for a few days (they go fast especially the close-in ones). There are parallel events to register for like Contest University or the QRP "4 Days in May", plus Contest and DX Dinners and AmSat get-togethers, etc. Or, if you wish to sell in the flea market it is best to get spaces early. Just note that it is NOT in Dayton, Ohio anymore. It is in Xenia, OH, a smidge east of Dayton.

But why would you wish to go? As Molly Shannon on SNL said, "Don't get me started!" It is the largest gathering of hams in the world. (Germany's *Hamradio-Friedrichshafen* is a very close 2nd). All the major and minor vendors that you know are there, along with the Mom and Pop dealers, and even ones that you don't know yet. Lots of technical presentations and anything ham radio that you might wish to see and try and talk about is there at Dayton along with the soon-to-be released new radios, accessories or antennas. ARRL has a huge turn out and those authors/contributors to QST, On the Air, QEX or NCJ are there to talk to face to face. It is the best 3 days of ham radio you have ever spent. (With the Greater Houston Ham Fest a close second.)

I have been to Dayton Hamvention (Hara Arena) in Dayton 6 times, and hopefully, I will be in Xenia this next year at the new venue. Hope I will see you there. You will not be disappointed with almost 30K hams in one place. I have always referred to it as the mecca of Ham Radio.

The flea market is huge. If you went to the Greater Houston Ham Fest, you saw the flea market tables in building C. Take that area times about 20. First time I went to Dayton in 1996 it took me 8 hours to go thru the complete flea market, up and down every row (at the Hara Arena). It was fantastic. Everything you could wish to find will be there multiple times.

So find out more at **www.hamvention.org** and keep visiting that web site for updates. Also, have a look at past QST's that describe the activities with pictures if you don't believe what I have said. Talk to Steve, KG5ICR (he's been three times -- once at Hara Arena, the old place, and twice at the new Xenia venue), other BVARC members have also traveled there. See the BVARC newsletter June 2010, page 9. It is well worth the minimal costs to get an ear-to-ear smile that lasts for days. I'll see you there enjoying your hobby. 73...W5RH

The next BVARC test session will be **Saturday November 4**th at 10:30am. **Pre-registration is required.**For new licensees the testing fee, paid at the session is \$15. An additional \$35 license fee (totaling \$50), will be collected by the FCC separately for new, renewal and vanity calls. License upgrades **do not** pay the added \$35 fee, just the \$15 session fee.

YOUTH LICENSING INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The ARRL has created a youth program (18 and under) to defray the licensing costs to a total of **\$5** (deducting the \$35 increase and \$10 off the \$15 VE session fee). See: http://www.arrl.org/youth-licensing-grant-program

Also, BVARC is implementing its own program for **youth** licensing.

We'll provide a <u>new VHF/UHF transceiver (Baofeng, limited supply)</u> at the VE session, to youth that successfully pass their Technician test. This is the result of a very generous grant from a BVARC member.

Bottom line, a young person for \$5, can walk into a test session and walk out with a new radio and a pending license.

Examination sessions are held each month, usually on the same day as the Saturday BVARC Board meeting (most times, the first Saturday of the month). These sessions are at the Bayland Park Community Center, 6400 Bissonnet St., Houston TX 77074.
